7. Hazard exposure and radiation dose of all workers will be minimized in accordance with the ALARA, As Low As Reasonably Achievable principle.
8. We will comply with all applicable environmental, health and safety (EHS) laws and regulations
9. We will work to eliminate where possible or limit to lowest practicable levels, adverse effects on the environment from our products, services, facilities, and activities.
10. We will implement programs and objectives to conserve natural resources, prevent pollution, and minimize waste.
